is a Fairtrade Church.

This means we have committed to:

- *Use Fairtrade tea and coffee after services and in all meetings for which you have responsibility*

We buy our tea, coffee & sugar from Traidcraft, who also support small farmers and suppliers beyond the Fairtrade standards.

- *Move forward on using other Fairtrade products such as sugar, biscuits and fruit*

We already use Fairtrade sugar, and there are Traidcraft cards on sale in Duffus Church all the time. When we can, we'll use fairtrade biscuits and other products.

- *Promote Fairtrade during Fairtrade Fortnight and during the year through events, worship and other activities whenever possible*

We try and have events in Fairtrade Fortnight - in 2018 we're combining a Fairtrade "Big Brew" with an Eco-Congregation/Earthtime Clothes Swish on 17th February in Hopeman Memorial Hall 10am-12noon.

We hold Traidcraft stalls a few times a year at church, and reflect on the issues around Fairtrade and justice regularly in our worship and prayers.
